


Who remembers the LAKE VILLA CAFÉ M. Daube, Prop.?

Martha Christine Hansen Daube moved to Lake Villa in approximately 1916 where she raised her daughters: Myrtle Elizabeth, Frances Dorothy and Genevieve Martha (known as Babe). She held a number of jobs to support her three girls including Sherwood Park for Clare and Edith Sherwood, Pickard China in Antioch, and as a cook at Cedar Crest Country Club. Martha also worked with Mamie Kapple opening and closing E.J. Lehmann's summer home.

Graham Cracker Pie


2 c. graham crackers, rolled ½ c. butter ½ c. sugar 1 tsp. cinnamon
Mix together and line pie plate with above mixture and save ¾ of above

mixture for top. $(3/4 \text{ or } \frac{3}{4} \text{ cup}??)$

Filling:

Scald 2 c. milk ½ cup sugar lump of butter 3 T. cornstarch mix with cold milk and add to above mixture. Cook until thick, then add 3 egg yolks well beaten.

1 tsp. vanilla Cool mixture Add filling to crumbs on pie plate then add the beaten egg whites with ¼ tsp. cream of tartar, ½ c. sugar, pinch of salt vanilla



Griddle Cakes

2 c. flour 1 tsp. salt 1 tsp. baking soda 1 or 2 eggs

1 Tblsp. sugar 2 Tblsp. Shortening

2 cups sour milk or buttermilk

Sift flour, add soda, sugar and salt. Beat eggs until light; combine eggs, milk and melted shortening. Add dry ingredients to liquid. Mix well and beat until smooth.

Raisin Wine


6 lbs. raisins put through grinder

4 1/2 lbs. sugar

3 gallons lukewarm water

1 1/2 cakes yeast

Mix altogether, let stand for 21 days. Stir twice a day. Drain off. Then let stand for 4 days, then bottle.



Salad Dressing by Ada Effinger

1/4 cup lemon juice
1/4 cup salad oil
1 egg yolk, unbeaten
1/2 tsp. salt, few grains of red pepper
1 tsp. dry mustard
2/3 cup Eagle Brand condensed milk.
Mix all together in jar and shake well.
