

Page from the Past: Christmas 1966

Let's jump in the LVHS Time Machine! Destination...December 1966! Let's see what's going on in Lake Villa this Christmas season...

***Beginning on Dec. 1st, the Lake Villa VFW Post will have Christmas trees on sale. Balsams and Scotch Pines will be available, starting at \$3.00.

***Postmaster, Joseph Hucker, expects an increase in mail volume this year, with December's totals expected to exceed 200,000 pieces. The Post Office will be staying open until 5pm on Dec. 10th and 17th. Customers may also bring parcels to the branch office, located at Slove's Bakery in the Linden Shopping Plaza.

***The Red Cross is collecting Christmas gifts for our boys over in Vietnam. Top requests from our brave GI's are: liquid bug repellant, lighter flints, foot powder, plastic soap dishes and sturdy pocket combs. Also welcome are holiday treats such as fruitcakes, tinned cookies, family pictures and hometown newspapers.

***Parkway Foods in Grayslake is offering all the fixings for your Christmas dinner: turkeys are .35 cents/lb, cranberry sauce 4 cans for .85 cents, a fifth of Jim Beam Whiskey for \$3.98, and a luscious pumpkin pie for .69 cents.

***Lake Villa Board of Trustees approved the expenditure of \$90 for Christmas decorations on the water tower. Two large stars will be put up, one on each side. The stars will be usable for many years to come. The Lindenhurst Teenager's Club will be having their Christmas dance Friday, Dec. 16th at the Civic Center. Everything will be free for the members. Jimmy Dalgaard's band, The Town Criers, will provide the music for dancing.

***The Lake Villa Trust & Savings Bank is offering a free pair of bayberry candles to anyone opening a Christmas Club account. Save a small amount each week and be bill-

***Homeowners are cautioned to be on the lookout for "bulb-snatchers". Police departments in Antioch and Round Lake have answered reports of seven thefts of light bulbs since outdoor Christmas decorations have been on display.

the Silver Beaver award, the highest honor awarded to adult volunteers. Stanley loved jigsaw puzzles. He owned and operated Stan's Sharp "N" Shop in Mundelein for several years. Stanley was also known as the best whistler. He would add his whistling talent to the piano music of his mother and guitar/banjo playing of his brother Kenny. Stanley was a paraplegic, unable to walk but got around on crutches all his life until a fall and broken leg required a move from home to Libertyville Manor. He will be deeply missed by family and friends.

History on the Table

The following recipes were submitted by the residents of Cedar Village, Lake Villa, Illinois in September 1988. The cookbook, *Everyday Foods*, was donated to LVHS by Darlene Dorfler, daughter-in-law of early resident Ruby Dorfler.

Cranberry Pumpkin Bread

2 eggs, slightly beaten
1T. pumpkin pie spice
2 cups sugar
1 t. baking soda
½ cup oil
½ t. salt
1 cup Libby's solid pumpkin
1 cup chopped cranberries
2 1/4 cups flour

Combine eggs, sugar, oil & pumpkin, mix well. Combine flour, pie spice, soda & salt in large bowl, make well in center. Pour pumpkin mixture into well, stir just until dry ingredients are moistened. Stir in cranberries. Spoon batter into 2 greased & floured 8 x 3 ³/₄" x 2 ¹/₂" aluminum loaf pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.


Banana Bread

3 large ripe bananas
*pinch of salt
2 cups flour
1 cup sugar
1 t. soda
2 eggs
1 t. baking powder
½ cup nuts
1/3 cup shortening

Cream shortening & sugar, bananas & sifted dry ingredients. Add nuts. Mix thoroughly then pour into a greased & floured loaf pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. *In measuring* remember: *Pinch is much as can be taken between tip of finger and thumb.

First Baby Contest

Being the "first baby" to be born into the new year in the 1960's was a lucrative achievement!



The first baby born in 1965, for example, had 52 prizes and gifts awaiting the arrival. This *First Baby Contest* was sponsored by Lakeland Newspapers, and publisher M.R. Schroeder. The first baby had to be born in a Lake County hospital, and exact time of birth had to be certified by the attending

physician. If two babies arrived at the exact same time, the winner was determined by lot.

Examples of prizes given by local merchants offered to the winning family in 1965 included; Pratser's Silver Saddle, chicken dinner for the

proud parents; Reed-Hills Florist, plant for parents; Dalgaard's IGA, \$5 in Gerber baby food; Ben Franklin Drugs, a vaporizer; Parkway Foods, \$10 worth of baby food; Lake Villa Trust & Savings, \$10 savings account; Bulko Service Station, one tank of gas;



Schaefer's Bakery, baby's Christening cake; and for Dad... from Lee's Shell Service, a free grease job and oil change!

History of Christmas Seals

Christmas seals are a traditional part of the holiday season. It began in 1907 when tuberculosis was rampant in the United States. A




small sanatorium in Delaware was struggling to keep its doors open when Emily Bissell designed the first Christmas seal as a fundraiser. The seals were sold at the post office for a

penny each with the hopes of raising \$300. The idea turned out to be very popular and was even endorsed by President Theodore Roosevelt. The campaign ended up raising 10 times the goal!

Today the American Lung Association continues to offer Christmas Seals as a means of funding its mission. Research focuses on more current issues such as lung cancer, asthma, and the dangers of secondhand smoke and air pollution.

Lake Villa Classmate, the newspaper of Lake Villa Grade School, Jean Cribb, editor, ran this in the December 16, 1932 issue. It is available to view in the LVHS files.

Fifty Years Ago

The following are from Lakeland Newspapers during November and December 1972.

'Favorite Sons' Seek Election On Tuesday

This article reads, in part:

Voter registration for [Antioch and Lake Villa] townships have set records. Since 1970, Antioch registration has jumped from 5,040 to 6, 338 and Lake Villa registration has increased from 4,409 to 5,946. Voter registration for Lake County soared from 143,900 in November, 1970, to 183,002 this year.

County Clerk Grace Mary Stern said that a "good healthy portion" of the new voters are in the age bracket of 18-21, which for the first time in a general election, will be eligible to vote.

Voters will again use the IBM punch card for casting their ballots.

Polls are open on Tuesday, Nov. 7, from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mrs. Stern said she expects a late vote tally because the judge retention ballots must be counted by hand at the precinct. She is predicting a complete vote tally as late as noon, Wednesday, Nov. 8.

Note--Major election results were:

- Richard Nixon/Spiro Agnew were reelected over George McGovern/ Sargent Shriver for President.
- Dan Walker defeated incumbent Richard Ogilvie for Illinois Governor.
