History on the Table:

With the intention to create a cookbook, these recipes were collected from Lake Villa residents during the Village's Centennial celebration in 2001. The cookbook was never made, and the recipes made their way to the Historical Society. Here is a recipe that was submitted:

Christmas Shortbread – For the Birds By: Elaine Teltz

- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. vegetable shortening
- 2 c. flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. packed brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. nutmeats
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. cranberries or raisins

Cream shortening. Add Flour and sugar. Stir in fruit and nuts. Mixture should be crumbly. Add water if needed. Cut into cookie ornaments for outside tree or pat onto cookie sheet for crumbling. Bake at 350 until lightly brown. 15 minutes.
