

A PAGE FROM THE PAST

Lake Villa Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4308, 130 E. Grand Ave., Lake Villa

(The historical data below was gleaned from Lake Villa Then and Now: Centennial History of Lake Villa, Illinois. Current information was provided by Commander George Simons and Auxiliary President Anne Simons. A future addition of Vintage Views looks forward to presenting the history of the Kadettes and Junior Kadettes.

In September 1954, veterans of three major military campaigns met at the Lake Villa Village Hall, taking the first steps to form the Lake Villa VFW. The first Commander was Anthony Sciacero.

Lake Villa VFW Post 4308 and the VFW Auxiliary officially came into existence on November 27, 1954, in the Lake Villa Grade School gymnasium. There were one hundred veterans on the original charter issued by the National Department of Veterans of Foreign Wars. Fifteen women made up the original Auxiliary. Frances Barnstable Sciacero was their first president.

December 1, 1956, members of the Lake Villa Post 4308 were presented the keys to their new building which had previously been a woodworking shop owned by Walter Boss. Volunteers gave of their time and talent to pay off the mortgage and remodel the building. Bingo games were another source of income.

Commander George Simons

was elected Commander of Post 4308 following the untimely death of Commander Thomas Denman in August, 2018. (Commander Tom Denman's final project completed shortly before his death was raising funds and purchasing 10 scooters for veterans at the Great Lakes Lovell VA Hospital.)

Commander George Simons works together with the Post membership of 324 to support the VFW and all its endeavors. They support the youth by sponsoring Boy Scout Troop 323, the Timberwolves and Cheerleaders, Scholarship Essay programs for middle and high school students and visiting the schools on Veterans Day. Programs for youth are a priority of the VFW. Corned beef and cabbage is a specialty at the VFW on St. Patrick's Day following the parade in Lake Villa. The annual Memorial Day parade is sponsored by the Post and Auxiliary to honor deceased veterans of all wars with a memorial service after the parade at Lehmann Park. Poppy Day proceeds help veterans of the community.

ANNE SIMONS, President, Lake Villa VFW Auxiliary added the following:

In late 2015 the VFW Ladies Auxiliary was changed to VFW Auxiliary (removing the word LADIES). To become a member of any VFW Auxiliary you must be at least 16 years old and a family member of a veteran eligible for membership in the VFW.

Anne Simons is currently serving her third year as president of the Lake Villa VFW Post 4308 Auxiliary. Many of the 65 members of the Lake Villa Auxiliary are very long time members. A Flag Etiquette program for youth was completed in August. Supporting Blue Star families by sending care packages of personal supplies is among the current Auxiliary projects supported in part by biannual Bunco parties. (Blue Star families include any immediate family member

of Active Duty Military Personnel.) A Baby Shower is currently in the planning for 2019 for families with one or more active duty members expecting a baby.

Our sympathy to the friends, family and colleagues of Commander Tom Denman who died on August 4, 2018 at the age of 48 years. Tom served his country in the US Navy and was a proud veteran of Desert Storm. Tom was a Life Member and current Commander of the Lake Villa Memorial Post 4308. He was the current state VFW Community Activities Director and District Five Chief of Staff and Director. He served as Fifth District Commander from 2014-2017. History on the Table

Looking ahead to the holidays, here are cookie recipes from the LAKE VILLA MEMORIAL AUXILIARY to POST 4308 Lake Villa, Illinois from their 1962 cookbook "Our Favorite Recipes".

Soft Ginger Cookies: Mrs. B.J. Hooper

1 c. sugar ½ tsp. cloves

1 c. shortening
1 c. molasses
1 c. sour milk
2 eggs
2 Tbsp. vinegar
1 tsp. ginger
4 ½ c. flour

1 tsp. cinnamon

Cream sugar, shortening and add eggs and sour milk and molasses. Sift all spices with flour and baking soda. Add vinegar alternately with flour. Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Cool and frost with powdered sugar frosting.

Jolly Jellies: Dorothy Jordahl

½ c. oleo1 c. sifted flour¼ c. brown sugar¼ tsp. salt(firmly packed)1 egg white,1 egg yolkslightly beaten¼ tsp. vanilla1 c. walnuts, finely

½ tsp. rum extract chopped red currant jelly mint jelly

Cream oleo with brown sugar until light; beat in egg yolk and flavorings. Sift in flour and salt gradually; chill. Shape into small balls, (about ½ teaspoon dough) dip into beaten egg white. Roll in walnuts, place on ungreased cookie sheet, making hollow with tip of finger in each ball. Bake at 375 degrees for 5 minutes, remove from oven and press in center hollows again with thimble, return to oven and bake 10 minutes longer or until firm. Remove from oven and fill centers with jelly.
