# **History on the Table:**

Before you put that paper bag of fast food on the kitchen table, please note the following instructions for "Setting of Table and Serving of Meals" found on page 13 of the Community Club Cook Book, Grayslake, Illinois. The cookbook was donated by Jean Culver Wooley. While there is no date noted, there was a page from the 1913 Watkins Almanac and a postcard from Merchants & Farmers Bank, Grayslake, Illinois dated January 1, 1915 tucked inside the cookbook.

"Always arrange a table as neatly and attractively as possible. The appearance of table and method of serving meals have an important effect on palatability and digestibility of foods.

The table may be covered with a silence cloth and tablecloth. Or for breakfast or lunch the bare table may be arranged with doilies at the individual places, and for all dishes of food, or with a lunch cloth or table runners. The tablecloth is always used for dinners. In putting on the cloth see that the center crease is exactly in the center of the table and ends and corners are even. A centerpiece of fresh flowers or small plant adds to the appearance of the table.

General rules for placing silver are: Fork or forks at left of plate; knife or knives at right with sharp edge toward the plate; spoons at right of knife. All silver is placed one inch from edge of the table. The napkin may be placed at left of fork. The water glass is placed at right end of the knife blade. The bread and butter plate is placed at the left, near the end of the fork. Cups should be placed so handles are turned in right direction.

All food must be passed to the left so that the person may use the right hand more conveniently in taking the food.

In clearing the table first remove all the dishes containing food, then the dishes from each place. All dishes pertaining to one course must be removed before the next course is served. If there are crumbs on the table, remove these between courses. In filling a water glass, remove it from table."

#### PAGE FROM THE PAST

Thanks to LVHS member Paul Stenzel for sharing his experience as a Vietnam Veteran on the October, 2014 Honor Flight trip to Washington D.C. Paul Stenzel served with the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division, 1<sup>st</sup> Brigade in the Central Highlands, Vietnam in 1967-1968. Here is his story:

I was fortunate to be chosen as a Vietnam Veteran to be part of the Lake County Honor Flight's third trip to Washington D.C. I was picked up October 4, 2014 at my sister Shirleyann's house in Grayslake, by "Sarge" of Metrocab at about 3:45AM and driven to Veterans Memorial Park of North Chicago, but not before we stopped for coffee and an Egg McMuffin.

Our group of 19 Veterans from WWII, Korea and Vietnam were each provided a Guardian

(some were their family members) for the entire trip. After a briefing and distribution of flight packages we boarded our bus at 5AM and were provided police escort by North Chicago, Lake County Sheriff and Wisconsin State Police to Mitchell Field in Milwaukee for Southwest Airlines flight #4337 departing at 7:20AM for Baltimore, Maryland. As the plane taxied on the tarmac, two fire engines shot streams of water in an arc over it and with the sunrise a rainbow appeared.

We arrived at Baltimore's BWI airport about two hours later where they duplicated the rainbow effect. We assembled to load on a Shore Motor coach bus which took us to the US Navy Memorial where we had a box lunch. Our next stop was the **World War II Memorial** with its "Roll Call of the Nation" and Freedom's Wall" with 4000 gold stars commemorating the over 400,000 Americans who gave their lives in the war. A group picture was taken there.

A few miles from there we visited the **Korean War Veterans Memorial** and the **Vietnam Veterans Memorial** where I had only enough time to find a cousin's place on "The Wall" and a friend I knew from his grade school days. Several others I served with also have a place there.

We then went to the **Lincoln Memorial** which we first got a glimpse of from the WWII Memorial. Another group picture was taken there, after which we boarded our bus which took us to Fairfax, Virginia for a dinner hosted by the American Legion Post #177. We also witnessed the ritual of a **POW/MIA ceremony** there.

Our day ended with a meeting in the Jefferson Room of the Crystal City Marriott in Arlington, Virginia where we spent the night. After an early breakfast and checkout on October 5, we boarded our bus for the **Pentagon 9/11 Memorial**. In my opinion this was the most

impressive of all the sites by design and function. We then spent about two hours at **Arlington National Cemetery** which included the **Changing of the Guard ceremony** and pictures were taken with our guardians. Then we visited the **Air Force Memorial** where we had another box lunch.

Our next stop was the **US Marine Corps War Memorial** and another group picture was taken before the bus took us to the **Women in Service for America Memorial.** 

Our final stop was the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial which became a tradition from Lake County Honor Flight's first trip when a veteran asked to be present at the unveiling of his statue, located between the Lincoln Memorial and the Thomas Jefferson Memorial.

The bus then took us to BWI airport arriving at 5PM for the return trip on Southwest Airlines Flight #1784 to Mitchell Field and a late evening Welcome Home Ceremony at **Veterans Memorial Park** of North Chicago.
